#### What Kind of Giving Do You Prefer...

**Gap Giving:** This type of targeted giving is specifically for those who recognize the powerful impact camp has in a child's life and give so as to keep the cost for camper's and their families down to a manageable level. These funds cover the gap between the amount a camper pays to attend camp and the actual cost to the organization to conduct camp.

**Special Project Giving:** This identifies funds that address a specific project. 100% of designated funds go to the project with no admin funding withheld. Scholarships to camp, or purchase of a new board approved HVAC system would be examples.

**Memorial Giving:** Funds given that help the mission of the organization while honoring the memory of a specific person. Both the person being remembered and the giver will be identified in the next news update unless the giver asks to remain anonymous.

**Life Support Giving:** When a gift is given quickly in response to a need after the need becomes evident. A recent gift to replace the HVAC system in the lodge is an example.

**Facilities and Grounds Support**: Funding to help maintain the property. Support given to prevent problems from arising.

### Strategic Forward Motion...

Diamond Pavilion: Some will remember coming in the long driveway and seeing the baseball diamond in the field to the right just before getting to the gravel road that leads to the cabins. It is our plan to level a portion of that field and construct a 40'x60' pavilion with solar shingles that can provide the electric needed for the entire campus. The pavilion will serve retreat groups, church picnics, family reunions, and special "Diamond Weddings".



Nigerian Tree House: Did you know that whereas many local churches in the Church of the Brethren in the United States have been struggling to maintain their membership that the COB in Nigeria is vibrant and growing with over 1,000,0000 members. With such a large portion of the COB represented by the Nigerian Church the decision has been made to add a Nigerian tree house to the Global Village. Nigeria is also one of the nations where Heifer is active today.



International Global Citizen Training Center: Plans are currently underway to develop a two month training program for international high school students who will come to Shepherd's Spring where they will: 1. Learn to be servant-leaders who serve others and steward creation. 2. Build practical skills to design, launch, and monitor community projects targeted to help them grow as leaders. 3. Grow intercultural competence and conflict-resolution skills. 4. Develop systems thinking to address issues of sustainability and logical responsibility and to 5. Return home with a fundable Action Project, mentor, and follow-up plan.



Bruce T. Anderson, Shepherd's Spring's executive director since 2019, is retiring from that role and will soon shift to focusing efforts towards the development and successful operation of this new International Global Citizen Training Center.



Sarai Nazar Duron, is a graduate student at the University of Seoul in South Korea where she is completing her master's degree in international intercultural relations. Sarai has been at Shepherd's Spring all summer where she has assisted with the summer camp program. In addition she has been working to develop the framework for the proposed International Global Citizen Training Center as an internship for her degree. She is currently in central America developing necessary connections with several of the Christian schools that will be working with the program once it is launched.
